### Gaming Pieces Context:

c. 1607-1617, Second Well, Soldier Pits

### Values & significance then & now:

- Dice: people used in gambling, 2 or more players guessing the sum of a pair of dices thrown. Numbers marked ranged from 1-6, and opposite sides will get the sum of 7.
- Gaming pieces: they were chess pieces available for 2 players at a time.
- similar appearance and usage of dice and chess now and then
  - modern dice and chess were developed from the
  - ancient model and these old games were luckily well preserved among the old and treasured traditions
